DR. PETER NEWBERY SCHOLARSHIP

1. PURPOSE:

The United Church Health Services Society (UCHSS) established two <u>Dr. Peter Newbery Scholarships</u> in 2016 to recognize and honour the contributions of Dr. Newbery to rural health care in his community, the province, nationally and internationally. The scholarships are intended to encourage graduates of Hazelton Secondary School to undertake post secondary education in health related fields, science or liberal arts and to help offset expenses that students may incur in pursuing their post secondary studies.

2. CRITERIA:

To receive the <u>Dr. Peter Newbery Scholarship</u>, a student must be enrolled in Grade 12 at Hazelton Secondary School and must be planning to attend a Post-Secondary Institution. The scholarship criterion includes high academic standing, outstanding leadership and citizenship qualities.

3. FUNDING

The sponsor of the scholarship, United Church Health Services Society, will supply funding for the scholarship through an Endowment Fund established with NW Education '88' Foundation at 3211 Kenney Street, Terrace, B.C. V8G 3E9.

The value of the scholarships is three thousand dollars (\$3000.00) each.

4: REDEMPTION:

Note:

The Dr. Peter Newbery Scholarships will be paid in two instalments of one thousand and five hundred dollars (\$1500.00) each. Students must show paid enrolment in second term to receive the first payment and then

show paid enrolment for continued studies beyond second term in a post secondary educational program.

To claim the first instalment of the scholarship the recipient must produce, within twenty-two (22) months of the award of the scholarship, proof of registration and payment of tuition in a full time educational program at a recognized post secondary institute. The second instalment must be claimed within twelve 12 months following the first instalment. The recipient will present this proof to Hazelton Secondary School. Once approved by the school the school can request the NW Education '88' Foundation to make payment directly to the student. The Foundation requires the full name, date of birth, Social Insurance Number and mailing address of the recipient in order to issue the cheque.

Should the scholarship not be claimed by the recipient within the time allowed, the forfeited scholarship money will remain in the Dr. Newbery Scholarship account to be re-assigned, at the next appropriate time, to another recipient.

5. SELECTION:

The recipient of the scholarship will be selected by the Hazelton Secondary Scholarship Committee. Students will apply for the scholarship through the general process used for all 'local scholarships'.

SCHOLARSHIP CONTEXT:

Jodi Rush was a strapping young lad who towered over most of his New

Hazelton classmates from an early age. He was outgoing, loved meeting new people and was very kind-hearted, always looking out for those who needed help. He hated to see injustice and disrespect - he had no issues speaking up for himself or others when it was necessary.

He was most happy when he was elbow-deep into a new project - he was a true hands-on learner. His interests were diverse. As a teenager, he loved debating about current events and politics, cooking with his mom (who is a stellar chef), rebuilding engines with his best friend Mike, camping/fishing/hunting (Mike and Jodi spent many weekends 'living off the land' at Bell Lake), and creating new products in the woodworking shop with his teacher, Mr. Blackburn.

At the same time, Jodi seriously struggled with bullying from peers and with school life in general. He lived with an undiagnosed learning disability until he was 16, which had serious implications for all aspects of traditional learning. Thanks to his mom's tireless pursuit of help for him, his 'print disability' was identified in grade 11, and it transformed his school performance and his self-esteem. He qualified for a scribe - someone to explain printed text and to write down Jodi's dictated responses to questions and homework assignments. As a result, Jodi went from barely passing most classes to being an honour roll student.

Because he had so many setbacks in academic classes, Jodi naturally gravitated to any school subjects that didn't involve text. He found his groove in the woodworking shop, where he created beautiful and useful items for friends and family. He even won first prize in a Northern BC Forestry Innovations competition where students were challenged to create products with low-grade wood or recycled products. His creation was an armchair made from spalted poplar that had been felled in a brushing program and left as waste-wood. He designed and built seats and backs for his chairs from seatbelt strapping reclaimed from cars left at the New Hazelton dump.

When he graduated from Hazelton Secondary School, Jodi very much wanted to become a journeyman carpenter. He started out at the College of New Caledonia in Prince George. Unfortunately, he didn't feel comfortable asking for a scribe at college, and without the help, he was unable to complete his first year. His future was determined by a phone call from the mother of a Hazelton friend, who encouraged him to come to Grande Prairie in northern Alberta to work in the natural gas business.

This turned out to be a good decision. By the time he was in his late 20's, he was a crew supervisor and had demonstrated his strong inter-personal and leadership skills by training and developing a loyal team of field staff. He also became an avid reader! His life was sadly cut too short, at 31 years of age, in a motorcycle accident while he was on vacation on Vancouver Island. Many people miss him, and it's hoped that this scholarship will allow others to pursue their own passions and goals, in his memory.




